Hands, face, space, track & trace

Over the past few weeks, it has been heartening to see many of our parishioners returning to Mass. However, things are still far from normal and Wyre is an area of concern. How can we all play our part in keeping ourselves and others safe when attending Mass?

Hands. Please use the hand sanitisers as you enter and leave the church.

Face. All those who can are required to wear a face covering when in church. Please have your covering securely in place *before* you enter the building.

Space. When *entering* the church please be patient if you have to wait while the Stewards are seating other parishioners; you might even be asked to wait outside briefly. When moving around *inside* the church we ask households to keep to a 2m social distance from others. The easiest way to do this is always to ensure that you keep 2m away from those in front of you. When *processing to Communion* please keep 2m from the group ahead of you and allow an appropriate space before leaving your bench. When *leaving* the church please move away from the doorway without delay so that others can leave safely and do not have to walk through any groups.

Track & trace. Please complete a track & trace slip in your bench each time you attend Mass. Better still, scan in the QR code using the NHS Tracing app on your smartphone. In line with Government guidelines, your data will not be shared with anyone else and will be disposed of after 21 days. For more information on the NHS Track & Trace App: covid19.nhs.uk.

Musings from my hermitage ... Fr Geoffrey

Several times already, St Matthew's told us that faith is a gift from God, that belonging to the kingdom's offered freely to all who welcome Jesus into their life; all including those we may well think do not belong.

In this Sunday's gospel, Matthew wants to show Jesus escaping from the trap his opponents have laid for him. Once again, our Lord's integrity, his holiness, contrasts sharply with the hypocrisy of the religious leaders.

But what really interests Matthew, I think, is this. Notice what our Lord says: "Give back to the emperor what belongs to the emperor — and to God what belongs to God."

Jesus turns the incident into a challenge: Are we as careful about our obligations to God as about our obligations to the state — or to any other responsibility: our job, our relationship, family; our fun?

St Matthew wants us to weave God's affairs into the very fabric of our life, not to keep God in a separate compartment. Jesus has trusted us to make him known. But we can only make known a Christ whom we ourselves know.

So: How diligent are we about "God's things"? Do we give "the things of God" at least a fair share of our time, energy, resources, attention: Prayer — throughout the week? Reading and reflecting on the scriptures for ourselves? Building and healing relationships? Assisting those in need? Playing our own unique part in the life and work of the parish?

Recognising the many and varied gifts God has given each of us, and investing them for God's glory. That's the currency of the kingdom. That's what we owe to God.
