Musings from my hermitage ... Fr Geoffrey

All Saints and All Souls both celebrate the communion of all who are baptised, the unity of all whom Christ has named his brothers and sisters. All *Saints* celebrates those men and women now in glory with Christ. All *Souls* commemorates all the faithful departed who "died in their imperfection".

The Church teaches very little about this second group, but over the centuries human imagination filled the vacuum. This is what the current Catechism says: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven." (1030)

The Second Vatican Council put it like this: "When the Lord comes in his majesty and all the angels with him, death will be destroyed Meanwhile some of his disciples are in exile on earth. Some have finished with this life and are being purified. Others are in glory 'beholding clearly God ... as [God] is'. But ...we all partake in the same love for God and neighbour, and all sing the same hymn of glory to our God; for all who belong to Christ ... form one church and cleave together in him. Therefore the union of the wayfarers with the brethren who have fallen asleep in Christ is not in the least interrupted." (*Lumen gentium*, 49, 40.)

I think that's wonderful. So we pray for the faithful departed as we would for anyone in need of our prayers. The church assures us of our continued union with our brothers and sisters in Christ who have died.

What a powerful consolation. And yet, and yet. It's not the same as a phone call, a visit, or a hug. "Those we have loved long since, and lost awhile." (St John Henry Newman.) Pray for them; pray for one another, fellow wayfarers.
