From Bishop Paul to the priests, 3 March 2021. "Please be careful not to give any impression that things are returning to normal at the present time – they are not. Musings from my hermitage

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus recalls an episode from the Old Testament: Just as many were saved from death in the wilderness while Moses lifted high the bronze serpent, so many will be saved when he, the "Son of Man," is lifted high on the cross. Just as people looked upon the bronze serpent and lived, so all who believe in the redeeming cross of Jesus will be saved.

In Christ, God has entered with us into the new and eternal covenant. This is no repeat of God's past efforts: God's own Son has given his life for us. The One who was truly God and truly human carried to his cross the sin of the world. The cross and resurrection — the paschal, Easter mystery — reveals Jesus as the One who offers life eternal.

For the entire human race, for a world still blighted by conflict, hunger, and oppression, the cross of Jesus is a new start, just as it's a new start for each of us. Through baptism, we have been united with Christ in his cross and resurrection; our names now feature in the chronicle of God's tireless quest; the Creator's quest to draw all people into his life and love and vision.

God has brought us to life in Christ. How might we live this gift more fully? We are God's "work of art." How can we allow God to shape us into the people he created us to be?
