Musings from my hermitage

During the weeks between Easter and Pentecost, the Acts of the Apostles tells us of the first decades in the life of the Church: small communities of faith; heroic individuals like Paul and Barnabas; the disciples' struggle against the religious authorities; the spread of the good news.

What happened that first Easter had transformed the disciples: they wanted others to share what they had experienced with Jesus. This Sunday we hear how Barnabas introduced Paul into the communion of the apostles. As a body they enjoyed fellowship, communion in the risen Christ; as a body they experienced the consolation of God's Holy Spirit.

This notion of communion is at the heart of this Sunday's gospel. The image of the vine and its branches is immediate. Jesus is the vine; we're his branches. We and our Saviour are one living body. Our purpose is to bear fruit. It's our nature because we're branches of the vine of Christ. His sap flows through us, impels us to bear plentiful fruit, to the glory of the Father.

The image of the vine reminds us that our faith in Christ is both personal and corporate. Each of us is responsible for nurturing our faith, and for living our faith. We're each of us also responsible for encouraging one another, playing our own unique part in the life and mission of the Church, for which Christ himself has chosen us.

This Sunday's second reading puts flesh on this image. The fruit we bear will be evident in our faith and works, in our belief and obedience, in our prayer to God and our love of one another. Both. What we do in church, and how we live outside.

The season of Easter opens us to the pruning force of God's word, to the energy of the risen Saviour. What's the Lord asking of us today? How are we to continue the work our Lord has entrusted to his Church?
