SVP report on "levelling up"

The St Vincent de Paul Society (England & Wales) has published a new report that highlights charity's vital role in delivering locally-based support to "left behind" communities.

The research - From the Frontline: Tackling Regional Inequalities from the Ground Up - provides a snapshot of the St Vincent de Paul Society's (SVP) community-based "levelling up" work in 10 regional centres and through locally-based volunteer members, working in 17 of the 20 most deprived communities in England.

The report highlights: A 49 percent increase in the number of requests for help to SVP's support line, nearly 2300 in the last 12 months, showing an alarming trend of reliance on charities like SVP to deliver frontline services.
