Musings from my hermitage ... Fr Geoffrey

Good Shepherd Sunday. The gospel passage for this year directs our attention to the sheep, and their relationship with the shepherd.

They have good, safe pasture because they recognise his voice, respond to his call, and follow him. The gospel assures the sheep that they'll not perish, not be snatched from the shepherd (at the final judgement).

The Father had given Jesus a command: by handing himself over to death on the cross he would gather his sheep into one with the Father and the Son.

The decisive factor is whether the sheep recognise the voice of their shepherd, respond to his call, and follow him. In St John's gospel, this is always the crunch issue.

I'm wondering what reflection does that invite from me? us? ourselves, our parishes? the wider Church?

On Easter morning we proclaim the last sentence of St John's gospel: "These things are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name."

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus declares: "I came that [the sheep] may have life, and have it to the full, ... abundantly."

The Shepherd calls each of us by name.

What's the Shepherd saying to you today? Can you allow yourself to be attentive, waiting for the sound of his voice?

Where in your life now, with all that's going on around and within us, do you need to hear the voice of your good shepherd?

His voice is gentle, but insistent. He calls us by name, invites each of us — not just to have life — but to have it to the full, ... abundantly.

Are we perhaps fearful of "abundant life"? preferring things as they are? ... Or dare we trust Christ to show us how to live, and how to live to the full the life he has won for us?
