In the last year, more crews have been abandoned by their employers than ever before. Many are still being denied the right to leave their ships for even a short break away from the relentless noise and pressure onboard. Many are reporting more stress and poorer mental health.

On **Sea Sunday, 9 July**, we pray for all who live and work at sea. Our support will make a big difference to seafarers and fishers in need. Cafod's Fix the food system campaign

The focus of the campaign this year is seeds: protecting the freedom of farmers to choose which seeds they use to grow food. Small-scale farmers grow nearly half of the world's food.

Next weekend at Mass, **15-16 July**, there will be a brief talk to explain the background, and a large letter will be on display for all parishioners of all ages to sign to show their support. It is not a petition as such (no addresses) but will be handed in to the World Bank before their important meeting in Morocco in October.

This is an opportunity to show solidarity with small farmers who grow our food, but who don't have control over the seeds they use and who are being kept in poverty because of large companies and new laws forcing them to buy expensive seeds.
