Special collection next weekend

The special collection for the Catholic Trust for England & Wales (CaTEW) levy is scheduled to be taken the weekend of 27-28 August.

The Bishops Conference of England & Wales, whose work is funded by the CaTEW levy, has again reduced the amount of levy to recognise the financial impact on parishes across England & Wales of the Covid-19 Pandemic. The amount levied on our parishes has again been reduced on the previous year's levy. This reduction is expected to be only temporary.

The amount of levy due for Garstang is £1232.92; for Scorton is £304.42

Works in our parish cemetery

You will see that work is well underway preparing the next section of our parish cemetery for use: installing drainage, paths, and the concrete plinths for the headstones.

The cost of this work is **£20,000**; and having spent £110,000 repairing and renovating the church tower, we are short of funds indeed.

May I appeal to parishioners for funds to pay for the work in the cemetery? I'm all too aware that, with the increase in the cost of living, fuel, and all the rest, this is hardly a good time to be asking folk for significant money.

Perhaps forty parishioners – individuals, couples, families – might be able to donate £500. That would cover the £20,000, and I am willing to be one of these donors myself. If you are able to Gift Aid your donation, so much the better. Please read the piece below.
